

Providing Public Comment



- Any comments received after the deadline will be provided to the Board after the meeting.




Hawthorns Area Plan

Purpose:

- Comprehensive use and management plan for the Hawthorns Area of Windy Hill Open Space Preserve
- Prescribe future uses and management
- Identify resource and land management activities
- Establish public access opportunities

- * 2006: Property accepted by Midpen's Board
- * 2006: Preliminary Use and Management Plan (PUMP)
- * 2011: Property transferred to Midpen
 - Endowment
 - Conservation Easement held by POST
- 2012: PUMP Amendment
- 2012: Vision Plan
- * 2014: Measure AA



Windy Hill:

Trail Improvements, Preservation, and Hawthorns Area Historic Partnership



Improve trails, complete pond facilities. Increase multi-use trails, study possible increased dog use. Open Hawthorns Area, develop trails connecting to Portola Valley and Palo Alto trails. Explore partnerships to protect, restore, and interpret historic buildings. Improve habitat conditions in Los Trancos Creek. Preserve additional scenic open space as available.

Conservation Easement

- Granted by the Woods Family Trust to the Peninsula Open Space Trust (POST)
- Protects natural resource values of property
- * Allows low-intensity recreational uses and improvements typically offered on other Midpen preserves
- Restricts future development of new buildings and infrastructure



Conservation Easement – Allowable Uses

- * The following rights and uses are allowable at the Hawthorns Area:
 - "Passive recreational uses such as hiking, bicycling and equestrian use"
 - "Construction of unpaved trails or paths for non-motorized uses."
 - "Construction of a limited staging area (gravel parking lot, pit toilets, wood rail fencing, trail markers, etc.)"




