

The Midpeninsula Regional Open Space District staff is updating our agricultural policy through a public process to clarify and define Midpen's role in agriculture on the San Mateo County Coast in alignment with Midpen's coastal mission: To acquire and preserve in perpetuity open space land and agricultural land of regional significance, protect and restore the natural environment, preserve rural character, encourage viable agricultural use of land resources, and provide opportunities for ecologically sensitive public enjoyment and education.

Goals and Objectives

- Consolidate existing board-adopted agricultural policies in Midpen's Conservation Grazing Policy, Basic Policy, Resource Management Policies, Coastal Service Plan and other documents.
- Evaluate gaps and areas requiring clarification, such as Midpen's role in supporting farmworker housing.
- Create a decision-making tool for Midpen staff and board that is informed, consistent and effective.

Midpen's boundaries expanded to include the Coastside in 2004. Since then, Midpen has preserved more than 12,000 acres of natural and agricultural lands on the coast, and leases approximately 9,000 acres for conservation grazing and 40 acres for row crops. Midpen works in a close public-private partnership with Peninsula Open Space Trust and other local organizations to balance viable agricultural and open space conservation goals on the Coastside.
