2. Legislative Program 2018 (R-17-118)

Governmental Affairs Specialist Josh Hugg presented the staff report outlining the proposed legislative program, including the motivations behind development of a legislative program and the proposed structure of the program. The Board may adopt proactive policy positions to be taken by the District on a variety of relevant issue areas, which will help ensure consistent advocacy. Policies will also be prioritized according to the Board's Strategic Plan Goals/Strategy areas to provide a clear connection to organizational priorities.

Director Hanko spoke regarding the importance of wildlife corridors and land connectivity for healthy ecosystems in light of the proposed wall across the border of California and Mexico.

Director Harris expressed the importance of species protection and commented on the federal and state level threats to mega vertebrates, including high human population levels, negative interactions between people and wildlife, and proposed protection of sea lions and mountain lions.

Director Harris advised that Legislative Priority number 7 under Public Access and Education ("Funds and enables programs for hiring youth to work in parks and open space careers.") should be made more explicit for each of the two goals mentioned. One, to enable programs for hiring youth to work in parks, and two, to encourage careers in open space.

Director Harris advised that Legislative Priority number 8 under Public Access and Education should define what is meant by "public access, provide fire clearance, and enable housing rehabilitation." Director Hanko was in agreement.

Director Hanko and Director Harris applauded the quality of the Legislative Session Program 2018 draft.
