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Amend Legal Services Agreement with Jarvis Fay, LLP

GENERAL MANAGER'S RECOMMENDATION

Authorize an amendment in the amount of \$60,000 to an existing agreement with the firm of Jarvis Fay, LLP to provide specialized local government legal advice and litigation services, for a not-to-exceed total contract amount of \$95,000.

SUMMARY

The General Manager and General Counsel recommend adding an additional \$60,000 to an existing \$35,000 agreement for a total not-to-exceed contract amount of \$95,000. The Fiscal Year 2022-23 (FY23) budget does not include sufficient funding for the recommendation. A budget adjustment will be included in the next quarterly budget amendment process.

BACKGROUND

The Midpeninsula Regional Open Space District (District) has an existing agreement with Jarvis Fay LLP entered into by the General Manager and General Counsel in 2021, for a not to exceed amount of \$35,000. Additional funds are now needed to continue to engage the firm to defend the District in ongoing litigation.

General Counsel initially selected and retained the firm in 2017 to provide as-needed advice particularly focused on construction contracts. In selecting this firm, the District examined qualifications from a number of firms with a strong background in public contracts and municipal law expertise that could provide advice as needed, at a fair and reasonable price. The District selected Jarvis Fay as a highly reputable public law firm in the Bay Area whose partners are very accessible, at rates geared towards public agencies. The partners at Jarvis Fay have a wide variety of transactional and litigation experience.

The District entered into a new agreement with Jarvis Fay LLP in 2021 for legal advice on local government agency issues, including public contracts. The firm has provided advice regarding a variety of projects, including the implementation of the District's Design Build process, and the solicitation and award for the large construction contract for the 5050 El Camino Real Administrative Office project. The District's need for the services of Jarvis Fay increased due to unforeseen litigation in late 2022 resulting in the need for additional funds exceeding the General Manager's contracting authority.

DISCUSSION

The legal department typically utilizes outside special counsel services on an as-needed basis to assist on specialized substantive areas of the law, such as personnel/employment, public contracts, and tort/personal injury. The legal department's annual services budget of \$70,000 is used to obtain assistance on issues that are not easily attributed to a project budget within a specific District department, and/or to retain temporary services in the event of an urgent or special project that exceeds the legal office's capacity.

At the end of November 2022, a lawsuit was filed against the District related to a legislative action taken by the Board of Directors. The case is *Ashford v. MROSD*, Santa Clara County Superior Court Case number 22CV407741. The Board authorized the General Counsel to defend the District in the case (*Ashford v. MROSD*, Santa Clara County Superior Court Case number 22CV407741). Fortunately, Jarvis Fay is one of the most highly qualified firms in the state of California to represent local government agencies in this specialized area of the law. In late December, the firm agreed to represent the District in this matter under its existing agreement. It is anticipated that the firm's services will be required to continue to defend the District in that litigation during the next several months at a minimum.

FISCAL IMPACT

The FY23 Budget does not include sufficient funding to execute a contract amendment with Jarvis Fay, LLP to provide specialized local government legal advice and litigation services. The recommended action will require additional funds of \$30,000, which may be accomplished by shifting funds where a savings or lower than expected expenditures are anticipated. A budget amendment would be included in the next quarterly budget amendment process.
