Measure AA 20-Year Implementation Roadmap

# GENERAL MANAGER'S RECOMMENDATIONS

Receive an informational presentation on the draft Measure AA 20-Year Implementation Roadmap. No Board action required.

#### **SUMMARY**

On March 5, 2025, staff presented a project list for the Measure AA(MAA) program to the Midpeninsula Regional Open Space District (District) Board of Directors (Board) at its annual priority setting retreat and received Board feedback. Staff have used the project list to establish project timelines and develop a draft master schedule for delivering the remaining MAA program over its final 20-year timeframe (through 2044). The master schedule will be a useful tool to prepare the annual Capital Improvement and Action Plan (CIAP) and for budget forecasting and planning.

## **DISCUSSION**

In June 2014, voters passed MAA, authorizing the District to issue up to \$300 million in general obligation bonds over 30 years to accelerate land acquisition, environmental restoration and public access within District boundaries. MAA projects are grouped into 25 portfolios organized by geographic area. The District began using MAA funds in 2014. The fiscal year ending June 30, 2025 (FY25) marks the eleventh year of implementing the MAA program.

Over the last 11 years, significant progress has been made to advance MAA objectives. As of the end of FY25, the portfolio project completion is estimated at approximately 52%, and the net bond spend is approximately 37%. If grants and interest income are excluded, the total net bond spent would be approximately 47%. This aligns well with the 11-year span, or 37% through the 30-year MAA timeframe. These statistics along with a summary highlighting key MAA accomplishments completed to date, from 2014 through the end of FY24, are detailed in the *Progress update on MAA Commitments through the Fiscal Year ending June 30,2025* Board Report included in this Board retreat packet.

Looking forward, the District is committed to continuing its efforts to fulfill MAA commitments and is nearing completion of a 20-year MAA Project Plan (2024 – 2044) as a roadmap for completing the remaining MAA projects and priority actions.

## **Comprehensive MAA Project List and Optional List**

As part of the effort to prepare a 20-year roadmap, a complete MAA project list was first prepared capturing all projects from start to end and presented to the Board at its March 5, 2025 retreat (Attachment 1). The comprehensive project list is guided by MAA ballot language, specifically the priority actions that pertain to each portfolio and captures all the projects necessary to fulfill the MAA commitments.

The Comprehensive MAA Project List categorizes MAA projects into three groups as follows:

- Delivered projects that have been completed as of November 2025;
- In Progress projects included in the current three-year CIAP where work has begun; and
- To be Implemented projects not yet started; some are programmed for the latter years of the CIAP while most are planned for further out in the remaining 19-year timeframe.

A separate MAA optional project list (Attachment 2) captures the optional additive projects that could further the goals of the MAA priority actions should additional funding remain. Completing these projects is not necessary to meet the MAA commitments. These projects can be considered as capacity and funding allows, but do not carry the same priority as projects on the main MAA project list.

Note that Measure AA does not identify specific projects and instead identifies desired outcomes. Therefore, there may be other individual project alternatives identified at a later date that can equally meet the same goals as those listed for the outer years. The General Manager recommends reserving the flexibility to modify the project scopes or make substitutions in the future based on new information, promising opportunities, timely partnerships, and other considerations. All projects will continue to be subject to Board review and approval through the annual action plan and budget process before they are authorized for inclusion in annual work plans.

## **20-Year MAA Project Plan (2024 – 2044)**

Since March 2025, staff have further developed the scopes of the "To be Implemented" projects and established project durations. Using the project durations, a draft master schedule has been developed, taking into consideration proper sequencing, capacity, and resources (Attachment 3). The 20-Year MAA Project Plan includes projects as of 2024 and captures both the main (required) MAA project list and optional project list through 2044.

Of the 135 projects on the 20-Year MAA Project Plan, 33 projects have no estimated start and/or completion date as summarized below – of these 13 are required MAA projects and 20 are optional projects. These projects are listed in Attachment 4 with more detailed explanations why a start date and/or completion date cannot be established at this time.

- Rancho San Antonio Permanent Carpool Parking (optional project) is awaiting negotiations with the County to first confirm the status of the County Park management arrangement before further work can commence
- Alma Bridge Road Newt Crossing Project (optional project) construction timeframe by County Roads is highly speculative due to the high cost of the roadway improvements
- 22 projects are speculative because they relate to land acquisitions or require additional land rights, of which 11 are required projects and 11 are optional projects

• 9 projects require more defined scopes and/or potential partnerships, of which 2 are required projects and 7 are optional projects

While the 20-Year MAA Project Plan indicates that the District should be able to complete the remaining MAA projects within the timeline specified in the Bond language, it also shows that several public access projects are planned to finish near the end of the MAA program, leaving little room for change. The schedule further highlights that key project delivery departments, including Planning, Natural Resources (NR), Engineering and Construction (E&C), and Land Stewardship and Trails (L&T), will need to manage a substantial MAA project workload over the next 19 years.

For example, the Planning Department initiated five new MAA projects in FY26, most of which will take four to five years to complete, while also continuing three existing MAA projects. Given this workload, and even with the increased staffing capacity per the Financial and Operational Sustainability Model (FOSM) recommendations, Planning will have limited capacity to take on additional non-MAA projects. Moreover, each of these planning projects requires support from NR, E&C, and L&T, all of which must balance contributing resources to support Planning while advancing their own MAA Projects. In fact, all project delivery departments face similar challenges in balancing their individual project responsibilities with the need to support one another.

In summary, the District must be highly focused over the next 19 years and prioritize resources toward delivering MAA projects to successfully meet its commitments. As a result, some non-MAA projects may need to be slowed, deferred, or reduced in scope. The District must also stay disciplined in adhering to the project scope, schedule, and budget to the extent feasible to minimize delays.
