MROSD Board Members and LHCOSP Planners:

In anticipation of tonight's MROSD Board Meeting in La Honda, this letter accompanies 266 additional opposition signatures from petitions circulated from May 16, 2018 through June 12, 2018.

In total, more that 900 signatures have been gathered from community members in less than one month. 532 of the signatures are from La Honda, San Gregorio, Pescadero, and Loma Mar residents whose total population is 1,898 (United States Census 2010). Opposition signatures are also from Woodside/Skyline area (100+ signatures), other Coastside communities, San Mateo County, Santa Clara County, and Santa Cruz County.

The community is very concerned about increased traffic to the area. Currently, California Highway Patrol officers are not assigned to specifically patrol traffic on Highway 84 from Highway 35 to Highway 1. Similarly, the County Sheriff monitors this area for crime but not traffic. Both agencies do respond to incidents as requested. This is the exact stretch of road where MidPen wants to add a driveway with cars, buses, motorcycles, bicycles, and pedestrians.

The following is traffic documentation on Highway 84 from Highway 35 to Highway 1:

- <u>CHP</u> for previous 5 years to date, provided 32 pages of collision records, as well as <u>recorded</u> traffic violations (drunk driving, excessive speeds, wrong side of road, etc.) which increased from 21 in 2013 to 37 in 2017.
- <u>CalFire</u> responded to 84 traffic accidents from January 2016 to date.
- California Department of Transportation from 2013 through 2016 reported 101 injuries and 7 fatalities.

How could MidPen ensure "safe public access" on a road fraught with accidents, fatalities, and other traffic incidents?

In our letter of June 5th, 2018, we provided information about the local communities and their concerns. We support the following alternative Red Barn access plans:

- Trails from the La Honda Creek OSP parking lot on Sears Ranch Road to the Red Barn area are already planned
- Public access from a parking lot at the Driscoll Event Center would be safer, less intrusive, and more costeffective
- Permit-only parking at and docent-led access to the Red Barn area could preserve the natural habitat and historic site

MROSD Board Members and LHCOSP Planners:

Hundreds of community members are opposed to the Red Barn Access Area plans and have signed the attached "Red Barn Access" petitions which we wrote and circulated from May 16, 2018 through June 5, 2018.

Currently, 625 signatures have been gathered by volunteer community members in La Honda, San Gregorio, Pescadero, Half Moon Bay, Menlo Park, Palo Alto, and other local areas. Petitions were also located at the La Honda Country Store, Alice's Restaurant, Skywood Trading Post, and San Gregorio Store. We are continuing to collect signatures and will present the total amount at the MROSD Board Meeting in La Honda on June 12, 2018. Please do not add people to any mailing list, as we specified "no mailing list" on each petition. We requested residence addresses **to show the local opposition**, as these *are* the people *most* impacted by the proposed development and increased traffic on Hwy. 84.

Issues of concern from the community include:

- Not consistent with MROSD's Coastside Protection mission to "protect and restore the natural environment, preserve rural character" of open space land.
- Lack of notification to and input from the local community most impacted.
- Existing traffic studies may not represent a thorough understanding of the significant risks to public safety and may not take into account the most recent public records of incidents/accidents from the California Highway Patrol, Sheriff, and fire department, as well as consideration of *unreported* traffic incidents/accidents and violations (passing, u-turns, excessive speeds, etc.) at and/or near the Red Barn site on Hwy. 84.
- Additional traffic to this site significantly increases the risk of automobile, motorcycle, and bicycle accidents.
- Increased risk of fire danger: car fires / collisions are a leading cause of roadside fires.
- Impact to sensitive species and wildlife habitat in proposed access area.

We support the **alternative access points** to *view* the Red Barn area which are *already planned* such as the trails *from* the La Honda Creek OSP parking lot on Sears Ranch Road *to* the Red Barn area. MROSD could **preserve** the Red Barn historic site and natural habitat by providing limited **permit-only parking at** and/or **docent-led access to** the Red Barn area from the existing driveway rather than constructing the proposed hazardous driveway which leads into a blind curve and could potentially endanger the community and visitors to the area. Also, LHCOSP public access from a parking area at the Driscoll Event Center would be safer, less intrusive, and more cost-effective.

We urge the Board of Directors to consider this significant local opposition and to work with the community. Please uphold your Good Neighbor Policy and the mission of the Coastside Protection Program: "To acquire and preserve in perpetuity open space land and agricultural land of regional significance, protect and restore the natural environment, preserve rural character, encourage viable agricultural use of land resources, and provide opportunities for ecologically sensitive public enjoyment and education."

Barbara Hooper's public comment at MROSD Board Meeting - May 9, 2018

Thank you for the invitation to attend the MROSD Board Meeting on May 9, 2018 in Redwood City. The following includes the feedback about the Red Barn Access proposal that I shared in my 2 minutes during public comment, as well as other comments and documentation that I didn't have time to include.

- 1) As a San Mateo County resident, I am a strong advocate of MROSD and hike on the MidPen trails regularly.
- 2) However, I am not in favor of the Red Barn access proposal, and here's why!
 - a) First: It does not follow MidPen's mission and vision.
 - b) Second: It would increase traffic hazards on already dangerous Highway 84.
 - c) Third: Area would become a "tourist attraction" rather than a PRESERVE.

3) FIRST - MidPen Mission & Vision

- a) MROSD commits to preserving the rural character of the region. An unsafe driveway located on Hwy 84 and 70+ parking spaces do NOT maintain and showcase the coast's rural character and agricultural heritage.
- b) MidPen has not followed through with its promise to collaborate with the community. There are local objections (as noted in the board packet) but MROSD is still moving forward with the Red Barn access.

4) SECOND - Traffic concerns

- a) I did a *traffic study* for ONE hour on Saturday, May 5th, from 2:15-3:15pm, at the pull-out on Highway 84 in front of the Red Barn.
- b) **OBSERVATIONS** 300+ vehicles (see Traffic Study, page 2)
 - i) 252 cars & trucks, 34 motorcycles, 15 bicycles
 - ii) Although passing is prohibited, I observed the following risks and hazards:
 - (1) 6 cars/motorcycles passing other vehicles
 - (2) A car making a u-turn was almost hit by oncoming traffic
 - (3) FIVE (5) Porsches "racing" above the posted speed limit
- c) MidPen Traffic Study MAP doesn't represent accurate impact (see Driveway Access, page 3)
 - i) The potential for increased accidents with new ingress and regress of vehicular traffic into Highway 84 east and west bound is a *recipe for disaster*.
- d) MidPen Board members and staff need to do personal traffic studies at Red Barn pullout on Hwy 84
 - i) To see and experience the traffic flow at "prime time" on weekends so they can better understand the risks and hazards that would increase as bikes, motorcycles, and cars intersect at more locations.
 - ii) Note: MidPen traffic studies have NOT taken into consideration illegal traffic violations that occur daily.

1) THIRD - Preservation

- a) The definition of "preserve" is: maintain, conserve, protect, and care for.
- b) I am requesting that MidPen PRESERVE the La Honda Creek Open Space Preserve and not turn the Red Barn into a "tourist attraction."


